Shrove Tuesday - Tuesday, 4th March Join us for Mass at 7pm then pancakes in the Parish Centre and burning of palms afterwards. "Shrove" comes from the old English word "shrive" which means "to confess one's sins and marks the last day of feasting before Ash Wednesday where

we begin Lent, a period of Fasting, Prayer and Almsgiving.

# Ash Wednesday - 5<sup>th</sup> March

Masses at 9:15am & 7.30pm in the Church. A day of fasting and abstinence, marking the beginning of Lent - a season of repentance, renewal, and spiritual growth.



The Meaning of Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is a solemn call to conversion, reminding us of our need for God's mercy. The priest marks our foreheads with ashes, saying:

'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." "Repent, and believe in the Gospel."

The ashes, made from burned Palm Sunday palms, symbolize penance and hope, inviting us to turn back to God.

Fasting & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday is a day of both fasting and abstinence: Fasting (ages 18–59): One full meal, two smaller meals (not equal to a full meal), no eating between meals. Abstinence (ages 14+): No meat.

Receiving ashes is not required but serves as a powerful outward sign of our inward commitment to conversion.

- Living Ash Wednesday Beyond the Day Ash Wednesday is the gateway to Lent, calling us to renew our faith through:
- Prayer Spend more time with God in Scripture, the Rosary, or Eucharistic Adoration.
- Fasting Sacrifice distractions or comforts to focus on Christ.
- Almsgiving Show Christ's love by helping those in need.

May this Lenten journey deepen our faith and lead us to the joy of Easter and Christ's Resurrection.



1<sup>st</sup> Friday of the month, 7<sup>th</sup> March - Healing Masses at 9:15am & 7:30pm.

The Parish Centre is open for tea & coffee during this time. Due to the renovations around the Church we will not have all day adoration.

The Stations of the Cross, or Via Crucis, are a Christian tradition commemorating the events of Good Friday, focusing on Jesus' suffering and death. This devotional practice consists of 14 stations, each representing a key moment on His

journey to the crucifixion.
Originating in the 4<sup>th</sup> century, pilgrims visited Jerusalem to walk the Via Dolorosa, the path Jesus took to His death. Over time, local churches created symbolic versions of the route. By the 16<sup>th</sup> century, the

14 stations were formally established by the Franciscans. The Stations of the Cross serve to meditate on Christ's Passion, spiritually draw believers closer to Him, encourage reflection on personal struggles, and unite the community in a long-standing tradition. They provide an opportunity for prayer, deeper understanding, and connection to Christ's ultimate sacrifice.

HELPING YOUR CHILD RETURN TO THE CHURCH Many Catholic parents are heartbroken as their children drift from the Faith. Studies show that half of young Catholics leave before age 23. While this is distressing, there is hope! Here's a simple six-



step plan to help guide your child back: **1.Pray & Prepare** - Commit to daily prayer, fasting, and sacrifices for your child's return. Deepen your own faith through Scripture and Catholic teachings to be ready for meaningful discussions.

2.Engage & Invite - Show unconditional love, listen without judgment, and gently address misconceptions. Share Catholic resources and invite them to faith-based events to help rekindle their connection to the Church.

3. Have Masses Said for Them - Offer the powerful prayer of the Mass for your child's return. This is a great act of love and intercession.

4.Pray the Rosary/Chaplet Daily for Them - Commit to praying the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet daily for your child's return,

asking for Mary's or Jesus' intercession. **5.Let Them See Your Joy** - Live your faith joyfully. Let your child see the peace and joy that comes from your relationship with God - this can be a powerful witness.

6.Offer Up Your Suffering - Offer up any difficulties or suffering you experience for your child's return to the Church. This turns personal suffering into a prayer of love.

**Entrance Antiphon** Psalm 12:6

O Lord, I trust in your merciful love. My heart will rejoice in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord who has been bountiful with me.

1st Reading 1 Samuel 26:2. 7-9. 12-13. 22-23 Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph. So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him. Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice. David answered Abishai, Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from without guilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them. David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading 1 Corinthians 15:45-49

The first man, Adam, as scripture says, became a living soul; but the last Adam has become a life-giving spirit. That is, first the one with the soul, not the spirit, and after that, the one with the spirit. The first man, being from the earth, is earthly by nature; the second man is from heaven. As this earthly man was, so are we on earth; and as the heavenly man is, so are we in heaven. And we, who have been modelled on the earthly man, will be modelled on the heavenly man.

Gospel Acclamation John 13:34

Alleluia, alleluia! I give you a new commandment; love one another as I have loved you. Alleluia!

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them

to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect?
For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. 'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.
