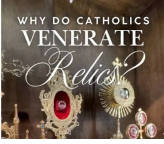

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Saturday, 15th August - **Holy Day of Obligation**

This feast celebrates Mary's being taken body and soul into heaven, where she shares fully in her Son's glory. **A special Mass will be offered on Saturday at 9:15am.** Since the Feast falls on a Saturday, we are obligated to attend both on Saturday Morning AND a Sunday Mass, as attending only the Sunday or Vigil Mass will NOT fulfil both obligations.



Understanding Relics

As we welcome and venerate the relic of a Saint in our Parish, we understand that some parishioners may have questions about what a relic is and why the Church gives them a place in our churches. For some, this may be unfamiliar, and that is completely understandable. We hope this short explanation helps us all to better appreciate this beautiful Catholic tradition.

What is a relic?

The word *relic* comes from the Latin *relinquere*, meaning "to leave behind."

A relic is a physical reminder of a Saint who lived a life of faith and is now with God. Relics may be:

- **A first-class relic** – a small portion of the body of a Saint, such as a fragment of bone.
- **A second-class relic** – something that belonged to or was personally used by the Saint.
- **A third-class relic** – an object that has been touched to a first-class relic.

Relics are kept in a **reliquary**, a specially prepared container designed to protect and respectfully display them.

Does this mean we have a dead body in our church?

No. When a small relic of a Saint is displayed, it is normally a very small fragment, carefully preserved in a sealed and authenticated reliquary. It is not the same as having a person's remains or a body placed in the church.

The Church has strict requirements concerning the authenticity, preservation and display of relics.

Why does the Church keep relics?

Catholics believe that **the human body matters to God**. Our faith teaches that we are not simply souls; God created us as body and soul, and we look forward to the resurrection of the body. The Saints are people who lived among us. They struggled, prayed, suffered, served others and followed Christ in the circumstances of their own lives. Their lives remind us that **holiness is possible for each of us**.

A relic therefore gives us something tangible that connects us with a particular Saint and with the history of our Catholic faith. It is a little like keeping a treasured possession of someone we love. The object itself is not the person, but it reminds us of that person and the love, memories and example associated with them.

Why do we venerate a relic?

We do not worship a Saint or a relic. We worship God alone.

When Catholics *venerate* a Saint, we honour the person because of what God has done in and through their life. We ask the Saint to **pray for us**, just as we might ask another Christian to pray for us.

When we venerate a relic, our attention is ultimately directed towards **God**, who is the source of the Saint's holiness. The Catechism teaches that the Saints reveal the "cloud of witnesses" who continue to participate in the life of the Church and to whom we remain united.

The Church's Code of Canon Law also explicitly provides for the veneration of Saints and relics, explaining that the example of the Saints helps the faithful and their intercession supports us.

What does "veneration" actually mean?

Veneration is simply an expression of **honour and respect**. When a relic is displayed, parishioners may:

- spend a few quiet moments in prayer;
- ask the Saint to pray for them and their families;
- pray for a particular intention;
- quietly reflect on the Saint's life and example;
- or simply look upon the relic with gratitude and reverence.

There is **no obligation** to approach or touch a relic. Parishioners may simply remain in prayer from their pew.

Why is this a blessing for our Parish?

Having a relic of a Saint in our Parish gives us a wonderful opportunity to **remember that the Saints are part of our Catholic family**. They are not distant historical figures. They are our brothers and sisters in Christ who have gone before us and now pray with the Church in heaven.

A relic can help make that connection very real: *this Saint was a*

real person who lived, loved God, struggled, persevered and became holy. Perhaps most importantly, relics invite us to ask:

"What can I learn from this Saint's life? How can I become more like Christ?"

The purpose of having a relic in our church is therefore not to distract us from Jesus, nor to replace the Mass, the Eucharist or the Sacraments. Rather, **the Saints always point us towards Christ**. The Vatican reminds us that devotion to the Saints and the use of relics should be guided by faith and should lead the faithful towards a deeper Christian life.

A tradition of the Church – not something new

The veneration of relics has been part of Christian life since the earliest centuries of the Church. The Archdiocese of Sydney itself has promoted the veneration of relics and has prepared resources to help Catholics understand this tradition.

Even the tradition of placing relics beneath an altar has an ancient place in Catholic worship. The Church's Code of Canon Law preserves the traditional practice of placing relics of martyrs or other Saints beneath a fixed altar.

So, as we welcome this relic into our Parish, we are not leaving behind our Catholic traditions. **We are continuing one of them.**

A beautiful invitation

We hope that, rather than seeing the relic as something strange or unfamiliar, we can receive it as an opportunity to grow in our understanding of our Catholic faith.

Let us allow the relic to remind us: **the saints were real people. Holiness is possible.** We are never alone in our journey of faith.

And the Saints continue to pray for us and lead us closer to Christ. May the presence of this relic in our Parish be a source of blessing, prayer and renewed faith for our whole Parish community. *"The saints are not simply heroes of the past; they are our brothers and sisters who accompany us and intercede for us."*

Saint Maximilian Kolbe was a Polish Franciscan priest born in 1894. From childhood, he had a deep devotion to the Virgin Mary. He became a priest, missionary and publisher, using modern media to spread the Gospel and encourage people to follow Jesus through Mary. During World War II, Kolbe helped people suffering under Nazi occupation, including Jewish refugees. In 1941, the Gestapo arrested him and sent him to **Auschwitz**, where he became prisoner **16670**.

After a prisoner escaped, the Nazis selected ten men to die by starvation. One of them, **Franciszek Gajowniczek**, cried out in despair for his wife and children. Kolbe stepped forward and offered his own life in exchange for the condemned man. His offer was accepted.

In the starvation bunker, Kolbe prayed with the prisoners, encouraged them and helped them face death with faith. After two weeks without food or water, he was still alive. On **14 August 1941**, the guards killed him with a lethal injection. Franciszek survived Auschwitz and the war.

Saint Maximilian Kolbe became known as a **"martyr of charity."** His sacrifice beautifully demonstrates Jesus' words: **"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."** — John 15:13

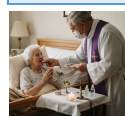

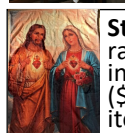
