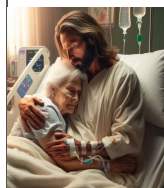
Support a Christian Chapel at the New Bankstown Hospital

Seven Things a Catholic Husband Should Pray For

1. Pray for a deeper relationship with God

A husband should first pray that Christ remains at the centre of his life. The closer he grows to God, the more faithfully he can love his wife and family. *"As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."* — Joshua 24:15

2. Pray for the grace to love his wife sacrificially

Catholic marriage is not merely about feelings. It is a life-long covenant in which a husband gives himself for his wife, especially when love requires patience, forgiveness and sacrifice. *"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the Church and gave himself up for her."* — Eph 5:25

3. Pray for his wife's holiness and protection

A husband should pray not only for his wife's health and happiness, but especially for her soul—that she will grow in holiness, remain close to Christ and one day reach Heaven.

4. Pray for wisdom to lead through service

Christian leadership does not mean domination or control. Jesus led by washing His disciples' feet. A Catholic husband leads his family by serving, listening, protecting and accepting responsibility. *"Whoever wishes to be first among you must be servant of all."* — Mark 10:44

5. Pray for patience, gentleness and self-control

Words spoken in anger can deeply wound a marriage. A husband should ask God for the grace to control his temper, listen carefully and respond with truth and charity. *"Let every person be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger."* — James 1:19

6. Pray for faithfulness and purity

A husband should guard his marriage from temptation, emotional unfaithfulness, pornography, inappropriate relationships and anything that weakens his covenant with his wife. *"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God."* — Matthew 5:8

7. Pray for his children and the salvation of his family

A father's greatest responsibility is not simply to provide material security, but to help lead his family toward eternal life. He should pray that his home becomes a domestic church—a place of faith, forgiveness, prayer and love.



Piety Store – Volunteers Needed

Why Does the Priest Say "The Body of Christ"?

When the priest or Extraordinary Minister says **"The Body of Christ,"** these are not simply words identifying the host. The Church teaches that, through the consecration at Mass, the bread and wine truly become the **Body and Blood of Christ**. Our response, **"Amen,"** means **"I believe"** or **"Yes, it is true."** It is our personal profession of faith: ***I believe that this is truly Christ, and I receive Him with faith and reverence.***



How Should We Receive Holy Communion?

In Australia, the usual posture for receiving Holy Communion is **standing**, although the faithful may choose to receive while kneeling. Before receiving, we make a **bow of the head as a sign of reverence**. The Church permits the consecrated Host to be received **either on the tongue or in the hand**; the choice belongs to the person receiving, not the minister. When receiving in the hand, the Host should be consumed immediately and reverently.

Did the Church introduce Communion in the hand?

The traditional practice in the Latin Church was to receive Holy Communion on the tongue. In 1969, Pope Paul VI permitted certain bishops' conferences to request an indult allowing Communion in the hand where the practice had already arisen. This was granted as an exception to the established practice, with the Church stressing that the Eucharist must always be received with the greatest reverence. Today, where it has been authorised, receiving in the hand is a legitimate option; receiving on the tongue remains equally permitted.

Receiving Holy Communion Reverently in the hand

When receiving in the hand, place one hand over the other, forming a throne for the Eucharist. After the minister places the Host in your hand, step to the side and consume the Host immediately and reverently in the presence of the minister. Ensure that no fragments remain in your hand before returning to your place. There is no prescribed requirement to make the Sign of the Cross immediately after receiving Communion; rather, we are encouraged to return to our place and spend time in prayer and thanksgiving, remaining attentive to the presence of Christ whom we have just received.

What Should I Do After Receiving?

After receiving Holy Communion, return reverently to your place and enter into a time of **sacred silence and thanksgiving**. You have just received Jesus Christ — Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. This is a precious moment to speak to Him in your heart: thank Him, ask for His grace, bring Him your needs and those of others, and simply remain with Him. The Mass calls us not only to receive Christ, but to allow this Communion with Him to transform the way we live.

Why Can't Everyone Receive Holy Communion?

Holy Communion is not simply a symbol of welcome or fellowship. To receive the Eucharist is to profess **full communion in faith with the Catholic Church** and to believe what the Church teaches about the Eucharist. For this reason, Catholic ministers ordinarily give Holy Communion to Catholics who are properly disposed to receive it. This is not a judgement on anyone's faith or relationship with God, but reflects the reality that the Eucharist expresses full communion with the Church.

What If I Cannot Receive Communion?

Those who are not Catholic, or Catholics who are not able to receive Communion at that time, are still very welcome to come forward for a blessing where this is the local practice, or remain in their place and pray. A beautiful prayer is one of spiritual communion: ***"Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul..."*** This allows us to express our desire for Christ and unite ourselves spiritually with Him even when we cannot receive sacramentally.

Why Is This So Important?

The Eucharist is the **source and summit of the Christian life**. When we come forward to receive, we are not simply receiving bread; we are receiving Christ Himself. This is why the Church asks us to approach with reverence, respond with faith, and return to prayer with grateful hearts.
